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Charity Yard Sale to Benefit Children and Families Experiencing Homelessness

All proceeds to benefit Anne-Marie House in Hudson

Hudson, NH – April 25, 2011 – Find a diamond in the rough, visit with local crafters, eat a handmade egg roll or hot dog and win raffle prizes – you can do it all and more at Anne-Marie House’s 3rd Annual Charity Yard Sale. The event, to be held on Saturday, May 14, 2011 from 9:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. at 180 Lowell Road in Hudson, will benefit Anne-Marie House (AMH), a transitional housing program for children and families experiencing homelessness.

Since 2005, Anne-Marie House has served the needs of local children and families experiencing homelessness by providing safe and temporary housing, wholesome meals, transportation, continuing education and other support services such as parenting classes and financial literacy workshops. Nearly 90% of Anne-Marie House families achieve independent and sustainable housing.

An “Early Bird” sale will take place on Friday, May 13 from 5:00-7:00 p.m. on the Anne-Marie House lawn. Admission is \$5. On Saturday, hundreds of items will be available for purchase including furniture, household items, clothing and books. In addition, sale goers can visit a crafter and vendor area, purchase concession items and participate in the “Home Sweet Home” Raffle, where every ticket is guaranteed a prize. Admission is free for Saturday’s activities.
